- **An Enemy of the People, 120 min. B&W (KK0D2606) ..... 24.95**  
*Adapted from Henrik Ibsen's groundbreaking play, this is a scathing indictment of a corrupt society set in a small town whose famed medicinal springs are actually poisoned.*
- **Death of a Salesman, 120 min. (KK0D2604) ..... 24.95**  
*This superb 1966 television adaption stars Lee J. Cobb, as a middle-aged man at the end of his emotional rope. George Segal and James Farentino play his disillusioned sons.*
- **Incident at Vichy, 80 min. (KK0D2631) ..... 24.95**  
*Eight men being held in a detention room in Nazi-occupied France are suspected of being Jewish.*
- **Memory of Two Mondays, 90 min. (KK0D2615) ..... 24.95**  
*This comedy-drama vividly portrays life during the Great Depression. Starring Jack Warden, Estelle Parsons and Dick Van Patten.*

*A fake kidnapping, a police stakeout and the decision to build a kidney-shaped swimming pool are just some of the outlandish events in this "hilarious and touching satire".*
